

GUIDELINES ON MONITORING OF STUDENTS' ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE

Senate, at its 77th Regular Meeting held on Wednesday, 30th April, 2014, approved the guidelines on monitoring of students' academic performance, as follows:

i. Performance Status

The academic performance status of the students will be specified in their Semester examination results, as follows:

- GOOD STANDING;
- PROBATION;
- WARNING;
- WITHDRAWAL.

The interpretations of the status are as summarised below:

S/N	Status	Interpretation	Effective Point
1.	Good Standing	Candidate, having passed on CGPA and CTNUP criteria, is not in any immediate danger and is free to continue in the Programme.	End of session.
2.	Warning	Candidate, having failed on the CGPA criterion in the current First Semester, is put on notice of a threatening PROBATION.	End of First Semester.
3.	Probation	Candidate, having failed on one of the two criteria of CTNUP or CGPA, is put on notice that he/she has the following year to reverse the trend, else, he/she may have to withdraw from the Programme.	End of session i.e. end of the Second Semester.
4.	Withdrawal	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Candidate, having failed on both CGPA and CTNUP criteria or failed on one of the two criteria for the second successive year, has to withdraw from his/her current Programme.• Any second PROBATION whether successive or not, attracts WITHDRAWAL from the current Programme.• Withdrawal from a Programme may not necessarily imply withdrawal from the University. A student who is advised to withdraw from a Programme may wish to apply for change of course to another Programme of his/her choice, provided he/she meets the admission requirements of the new Programme.	End of session i.e. end of the Second Semester.

Please note that, for students who were admitted in the 2013/2014 academic session and thereafter, failure on the CGPA criterion is when the CGPA is less than 1.50. For students who were admitted in the 2012/2013 academic session or earlier, failure on the CGPA criterion is when the CGPA is less than 1.0.

ii. Effect of the Phasing out of Pass Degree from the University Curriculum

- a. The benchmark CGPA for a Pass is 1.50 for students who were admitted in the 2013/2014 academic session and thereafter;
- b. existing benchmark CGPA of 1.0 for a **Pass Degree** would be sustained for students who were admitted in the 2012/2013 or earlier. This category of students can still graduate with the Pass Degree;
- c. the pass mark in all examinations would still be 40% for all the students.

Kindly note that the Pass Degree is being phased out, starting with the 2013/2014 100 Level students.

iii. Conditions for the Award of Degree

The CGPA determines the standing of a student's class of Degree at the final year. A Degree is not awarded unless a student has met the following conditions:

- a. all the compulsory courses must have been passed;
- b. the minimum passes in specified sets of Elective Courses must have been obtained;
- c. the specified minimum Cumulative Total Number of Units Passed (CTNUP), which is about 140 Units for most Programmes, must have been obtained;
- d. a UTME student must have spent a mandatory minimum of 4 years;
- e. a Direct Entry or inter-University transfer student must have spent a mandatory minimum of 3 years.

Please note that the above decisions of Senate are with immediate effect
