



University Auditorium, Ede, Osun State.

The academic Don and lover of microbes highlighted that microbes in their efforts to clean the contaminated environment can break down and detoxify pollutants. He further stated that they have contributed immensely to the development of the human immune system as well as developments of vaccines and <mark>tre</mark>atment. He said, "To harness the wealth of microbial diversity and the wonderful endowment in diversity, Nigeria needs to see biotechnology as a field of endeavour that can be used to solve many problems and come out of poverty. In a bid to alleviate poverty through harnessing microbial biodiversity in Nigeria, the Professor of Biochemistry, who specializes in Microbial Biotechnology and Molecular Biology stressed the need for the Federal Government to create a Ministry of Biotechnology, which will exist along with the present Ministry of Science and Technology.

"I want to urge the Federal Government of Nigeria to create a Ministry of Biotechnology while still retaining the Ministry of

Science and Technology; this will ensure purposeful development and funding of biotechnology," he said.

He, however, charged relevant ministries including the National Universities Commission, (NUC) to mandate the donation of basic equipment needed for biotechnological research to all tertiary institutions annually in order to ensure a dequate scientific infrastructure in tertiary institutions.

Prof. Olukanni further urged the Federal Government to take microbes seriously by establishing and funding Nigerian Type Collection Centre (NTCC) which will be located in six biotechnology centres of the

six geo-political zones in Nigeria. He added that the ministry should be vested with the responsibility of establishing a laboratory in each of the six geopolitical zones of the nation.

EXPERTS ORGANISE TRAINING IN DATA SCIENCE, MEDICAL IMAGE ANALYSIS

one-week special training in data science and medical image analysis (DATICAN) was hosted a few days ago by Redeemer's University, Ede, Osun State, to expose participants to supercomputers and High-Performance Computing (HPC) through collaboration with the University of Chicago and Argonne National Laboratory, USA.

Speaking at the opening program, the Principal Investigator of the project, Professor Benjamin Aribisala, described the programme as a necessity for those in the medical field and other fields of study.

Professor Aribisala highlighted the critical roles of Data Science in medical diagnosis as *nullisecundus* and explained why the project was tailored towards building capacity in Data Science and its medical applications.

According to him, "this version of the training was called Hackathon 2.0, as the first version was Hackathon 1.0, which was hosted by Lagos State University in April 2024."

He stressed that "the project was tailored towards building capacity in Data Science and its medical applications."

While recounting the inception of DATICAN and how the idea was conceived at the University of Chicago, USA, in 2022 when he visited as a Fulbright Scholar, the academic don expressed happiness that the same idea is now successfully delivered in Nigeria.

On the importance of collaboration across disciplines, he noted that Data Science transcends traditional boundaries, particularly benefiting fields like medicine and other applied sciences.

Professor Aribisala hinted that "DATICAN has awarded some scholarships to outstanding participants, highlighting that the programme nurtures future leaders in Data Science and medical research."

In his own submission, the Chairman of the Local Organizing Committee at Redeemer's University, Professor Adewale Ogunde, commended Professor Aribisala for his exemplary leadership in guiding the DATICAN team towards their achievements.


He also expressed gratitude to the sponsors of the Hackathon for their unwavering support and encouraged trainees to maintain their commitment to excellence in research and innovation.
