GENERAL UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Interested candidates must have five (5) credit passes in the SSCE (WAEC or NECO) at not more than 2 sittings in English Language, Mathematics and other subjects relevant to the course of study. Candidates are also to note that there are other requirements that may be specific to a Faculty and/or a Programme.

Candidates applying to the Redeemer's University are expected to sit for the Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME), and attain the National aggregate score. This is a statutory requirement for entry into Nigerian Universities.

In addition, candidates must complete online, Application Form of the University. No admission into Redeemer's University is possible without participation in the University screening exercise, and attainment of the required standard for admission into the University.

AVAILABLE DEGREE PROGRAMMES AND ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS IN REDEEMER'S UNIVERSITY

1) FACULTY OF BASIC MEDICAL SCIENCES

A) B.Sc. BIOCHEMISTRY

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

Only students who meet the general University requirements for admission into Redeemer's University, BSc. Programmes shall be offered places in the BSc. Biochemistry Programme at either the 100 level or the 200 level. Generally, prospective students would need to satisfy the following requirements before they are offered admission into the Redeemer's University.

For admission into the 100 level (UTME), candidates should:

- (i) obtain a minimum of 5 Credits passes at SSCE (or equivalent) in relevant subjects including English Language, Mathematics, Chemistry, Biology, and Physics, in not more than 2 sittings;
- (ii) UTME subject combinations shall include Use of English, Chemistry, Biology, and Physics for the degree programme.

Admission through Direct Entry

- (i) Two advanced-level passes must include Biology and Chemistry and either Physics or Mathematics.
- (ii) Upper credit in ND/NCE in Biochemistry, Biology, and another science subject.
- (iii) Credit in Professional Diploma in Biochemistry/ Biology obtained from a recognized institution.
- (iv) Two advanced level passes in Biology and Chemistry, and either Physics or Mathematics in IJMB.
- (v) Two advanced-level passes in Biology and Chemistry, and either Physics or Mathematics in JUPEB. A minimum of 8 grade points shall be considered from JUPEB.
- (vi) Upper credit in ND Science Laboratory Technology or any related disciplines.

Inter-University Transfer

Candidate must have registered and completed the first year of study in an approved University, with a minimum of 1.50 Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) at the end of the First year.

B) B.Sc. HUMAN ANATOMY

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

The admission requirements for the BSc Human Anatomy programme are presented as follows:

For admission into 100 level (UTME), candidates should:

- i. Obtain a minimum of FIVE Credits passes at SSCE (or its equivalent) in relevant subjects including English Language, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and Biology in not more than two sittings;
- ii. Have taken the following UTME subjects' - Use of English, Physics, Chemistry and Biology.

Admission through Direct Entry

Candidate must have passed:

- i. At least two subjects in G.C.E. 'A' Level, IJMB or JUPEB which must include Biology and Chemistry or Physics at grades to be determined from time to time;
OR
- ii. National Diploma/NCE in Biology or related Science subject with at least Lower credit from an approved Polytechnic or College of Technology; OR
- iii. University Diploma in Biology with a minimum of Lower Credit;

Inter-University Transfer

Candidate must have registered and completed the first year of study in an approved University, with a minimum of 1.50 Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) at the end of the First year.

C) B.SC. HUMAN PHYSIOLOGY

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

a). Admission into 100 Level is through University/Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME). Applicants must have five O' Level Credit Passes in English Language, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and Biology in not more than two sittings.

b). Direct Entry

- i. Two Advanced Level Passes in Biology, Chemistry and Physics in IJMB, JUPEB and their nationally recognized equivalent examinations
- ii. Upper Credit in ND/NCE in Biology or related Science subject. OR
- iii. An acceptable first degree in relevant biological and physical science disciplines.

c). Inter-University Transfer

A transfer student with good academic standing from related science-based programme within the University or another University will be required to spend a minimum of three academic sessions to be eligible for a BSc. Physiology Degree at the Redeemer's University. The application for admission of transfer students shall be approved by the Departmental and Faculty Board of Studies and Senate".

D) B.MLS MEDICAL LABORATORY SCIENCE

Programme Duration: 5 (Five) Academic Sessions

Only students who meet general University requirements for admission into Redeemer's University undergraduate Programmes shall be offered places in the BMLS Programme at either 100 level or 200 level. Generally, prospective students would need to satisfy the following requirements before they are offered admission into the BMLS Programme of Redeemer's University.

For admission into 100 level (UTME), candidates should:

- i. Obtain a minimum of 5 Credits passes at SSCE (or equivalent) in relevant subjects including English Language, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry and Physics, in not more than 2 sittings;
- ii. UTME subject combinations include: Use of English, Biology, Chemistry and Physics.

Admission through Direct Entry

- i. Candidates must hold a diploma or its equivalent from a recognized tertiary institution in Basic Sciences or Allied Health Sciences, OR
- ii. Hold a degree in any Biological or Life Science programmes.
- iii. Applicants with a Medical Laboratory Technician Certificate and a National Diploma in Medical Laboratory Science are also eligible for direct entry admission.
- iv. A-level applicants, including JUPEB, should have a minimum of credit in English, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics and any other Science subject
- v. Diploma certificate holders should have a minimum of lower credit from a recognized institution or professional regulatory body

Inter-University Transfer

Candidate must have registered and completed the first year of study in an approved University, with a minimum of 3.50 Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) at the end of the First year.

DURATION OF COURSE

The BMLS degree Programme shall run for five (5) years for UTME candidates and four (4) years for Direct Entry candidates.

E) B.NSc NURSING

Programme Duration: 5 (Five) Academic Sessions

UTME Subjects

UTME subject combinations shall include Use of English, Chemistry, Biology, and Physics for the degree programme

O'Level Subjects

The basic minimum entry requirement is 5 credit passes in English, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry and Physics at SSCE/GCE O' Level at not more than two (2) sittings.

F) DPT PHYSIOTHERAPY

Programme Duration: 5 (Five) Academic Sessions

Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME)

- i. The prospective students for the DPT training must satisfy the minimum entry requirements of the Redeemer's University for admission.

UTME Subjects

UTME subject combinations shall include Use of English, Chemistry, Biology, and Physics for the degree programme

O'Level Subjects

The basic minimum entry requirement is 5 credit passes in English, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry and Physics at SSCE/GCE O' Level at not more than two (2) sittings.

G) B.Sc. PUBLIC HEALTH

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

Only students who meet general University requirements for admission into Redeemer's University B.Sc degree Programmes shall be offered places in the B.Sc Public Health Programme at either 100 level or 200 level. Generally, prospective students would need to satisfy the following requirements before they are offered admission into the Redeemer's University.

For admission into 100 level (UTME, Four-Year Degree Programme), candidates should:

- iii. obtain a minimum of 5 Credits passes at passes at the Senior Secondary School Certificate (SSCE/NECO/GCE) examinations (or equivalent) in English Language, Mathematics, Chemistry, Physics, Biology (or Health Science), or any other Science subject, in not more than 2 sittings;
- iv. have registered for and passed the enlisted UTME subjects' combinations (Use of English, Biology, Chemistry and any other subject) for the degree programme.

Admission through Direct Entry (200 Level, Three-Year Degree Programme)

- i. Candidates with at least three Advanced Level credit passes in Biology, Chemistry and Physics, or any other Science subject are eligible to apply for admission.
- ii. Candidates with National Diploma (with a minimum of Lower Credit) in science or basic medical science programmes such as Community Health Extension Workers,

Microbiology, Biochemistry, Physiology, Science Laboratory Technology, Medical Laboratory Science, including other candidates such as Registered Nurses, Registered Midwives, etc are eligible to apply for admission.

- iii. Candidates who did JUPEB and have passed Mathematics, Biology and Chemistry or any other science subject (such as Physics) are also eligible to apply.
- iv. All candidates must, however, meet the 100 Level entry requirements of having at least five credit passes at the Senior Secondary School Certificate (SSCE/NECO/GCE) examinations in English Language, Mathematics, Biology or Health Science, Chemistry, Physics, or any other Science subject.

Inter-University Transfer

Candidate must have registered and completed the first year of study in an approved University, with a minimum of 1.50 Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) at the end of the First year.

2) FACULTY OF BUILT ENVIRONMENT STUDIES

A) BSc. ARCHITECTURE

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

Admission to 100 – level

Candidates who have successfully completed the Senior secondary school of the 6-3-3-4 system and obtained five credits at ordinary level or its equivalent in

Mathematics, English Language, Physics and two other subjects one each from the following two groups:

a) Technical Drawing and Building Construction

b) Geography, Economics, Land Surveying and Chemistry

Regular Admission should be through an acceptable pass of not less than 50% at the entrance examination organized by JAMB.

Advance Standing Admission: Candidates who fulfil the requirements above and who have obtained G. C. E. Advanced level, JUPEP or equivalent passes in Mathematics and Physics, or Mathematics or Physics and any other subject noted above may be admitted into the 200 - level of the programme. Any deficiencies in their background would be rectified by taking appropriate courses. ***However, candidates without Technical Drawing in O' level may not be considered for admission***

Direct Entry Admission: A candidate who fulfil admission requirements and in addition holds an ND or HND certificate in Architecture or Allied Subjects at **Credit Level** can be considered for Admission into the programme at the 200 level of the program. A candidate who fulfils **ordinary level** requirements and in addition holds an **HND certificate in Architectural Technology**, Building Technology or Urban and Regional Planning at Credit Level would be considered for special Admission into the 200 Level of the program. Any deficiencies in their background would be rectified by taking appropriate courses at the second level of study before proceeding to the third level.

Transfer Cases: Candidates wishing to transfer from one school of Architecture to another for some good reasons may be considered for absorption at the appropriate level. Any deficiencies in their background should be rectified by taking appropriate courses.

B) BSc. BUILDING TECHNOLOGY

Programme Duration: 5 (Five) Academic Sessions

100 Level Requirements

i. SSCE (or its equivalents) subjects and pass levels:

The candidate must have obtained five Senior Secondary Certificate Examination (SSCE) credit passes in the following subjects: English Language, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and one other subject from Building Construction, Fine Arts, Technical Drawing, Economics, Geography, and Biology.

ii. UTME Subjects:

Candidates writing UTME examination must select English Language, Mathematics, Physics and any one subject from the following: Chemistry, Geography, Economics and Biology.

b) 200 Level (Direct Entry) Admission

i. Advanced Level (GCE, IJMB, JUPEB, HSC, etc.) subjects and pass levels: The candidate to be admitted into 200 Level, must satisfy the minimum ordinary level pass requirements and in addition have at least two (2) passes at the GCE, IJMB, JUPEB, etc. in Mathematics, Physics, and any one of the following: Chemistry, Building Construction, Fine Arts, Technical Drawing, Economics, Geography, and Biology.

ii. ND/HND subjects and pass levels:

Holders of National Diploma (ND) with upper credit in Building, Civil Engineering or related disciplines in the Built Environment may be admitted into the 200 Level of the Programme. In addition, holders of Higher National Diploma (HND) in Building, Civil Engineering or similar related qualifications with lower credit may be placed also at 200 Level. Taking appropriate courses may rectify any deficiencies in a candidate's background. Such candidate must in addition satisfy the basic entry requirements stated for 100 Level.

c) Transfer of Students from another Programme or another University

A transfer student with good academic standing, from another programme within the University or another University, may be accepted into 200 Level or 300 Level to be eligible for a B.Sc. Building Technology Degree of the Redeemer's University. All transfer student admission applications shall be approved by the Departmental and Faculty Board of

Studies, and the Senate. In addition, such candidates shall also satisfy the ordinary level subject requirements as specified.

C) BSc. ESTATE MANAGEMENT

Programme Duration: 5 (Five) Academic Sessions

1. Admission into 100 Level

a). Admission into 100 Level is through University/Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME). Prospective Candidate must obtain at least five (5) O' Level credits in (SSCE/NECO/GCE) in not more than two sittings or its equivalent in English Language, Mathematics, Economics and any other two selected subjects from the following: Chemistry, Physics, Biology, Geography, Accounting, Commerce, Marketing, Building Construction, and Technical Drawing

b). The UTME subjects include: English Language, Mathematics, Economics and any other subject selected from: Chemistry, Physics, Biology, Geography, Accounting, Commerce, Marketing, Building Construction, and Technical Drawing.

c) Candidates who passed Pre-Degree Examinations from recognized Universities in addition to meeting the O' Level requirements in 1(a) above will be considered if the candidate registered for UTME and scored not less than minimum pass mark for universities.

2. Direct Entry

a) Holders of National Diploma (ND) and Higher National Diploma (HND) in programmes under the Built Environment or equivalent qualifications with minimum of Upper Credit Pass in addition to meeting the O' Level requirements in 1(a) above will be considered for Direct Entry to 200 Level.

b). General Certificate of Education (GCE), Advanced level or its Equivalent with passes at not more than two sittings in Mathematics, Economics and one other subject taken from Biology, Physics, Chemistry, Geography, Accounting, Commerce, Marketing and Technical Drawing.

3. Transfer of Students from another programme or another University

A transfer student with good academic standing, from another programme within the University or another University, will be required to spend a minimum of three academic sessions to be eligible for a BSc. Estate Management Degree of the Redeemer's University. All transfer student admission applications shall be approved by the Departmental and Faculty Board of Studies and Senate.

D) BSc. URBAN AND REGIONAL PLANNING

Programme Duration: 5 (Five) Academic Sessions

Admission into 100 Level

Candidates applying to RUN are required to sit for the University/Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) of the Joint Admission and Matriculation Board (JAMB) and attain the prescribed cut-off marks. In addition to the above, the University may conduct aptitude and character screening exercises for all candidates seeking admission into the University.

- i. The UTME subject combinations are: English, Mathematics and any two from the following (Geography, Economics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Fine Arts, Government, Civic Education, Computer Studies, Agricultural Science, Animal Husbandry, History, Physical and Health Education)
- ii) The minimum entry requirements for admission into RUN are credit level passes in 5 subjects at the SSCE/GCE O' Level/NECO/NABTEB or its equivalent obtained at not more than two sittings. The subjects passed must include five credits in Mathematics, English Language, Geography or Economics and any other two subjects from the following (Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Technical Drawing, Fine Arts, Building Construction, Land Surveying, Government, Civic Education, Agricultural Science, Animal Husbandry, Computer Studies)

b. Admission into 200 Level

The requirements for Direct Entry admission include any one of the following:

- i. GCE A-Level/JUPEB/IJMB or approved equivalent with passes in Mathematics and Geography or Economics may be admitted into 200 levels
- ii. Upper credit in ND in Urban and Regional Planning, Architecture, Estate management, Quantity Surveying or Land Surveying or Building
- iii. Credit pass in any TOPREC Diploma accredited institutions

c. Transfer student from another programme or another University

A transfer student with good academic standing, from another related programme within the University or another approved University, will be required to spend a minimum of three to four academic sessions to be eligible for a BSc. Urban and Regional Planning Degree of the Redeemers University. All transfer students' admission application shall be approved by the Departmental and Faculty Board of Studies and Senate. The candidate

must be willing to compulsorily offer all University wide courses and all Urban and Regional Planning core courses

E) B.Sc. QUANTITY SURVEYING

Programme Duration: 5 (Five) Academic Sessions

1. Admission into 100 Level

(a) The admission is through the Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) organized by the Joint Admission and Matriculation Board (JAMB). To be eligible for admission, candidates must have at least five (5) O Level credits (SSCE/ NECO/ GCE) in not more than two sittings or its equivalents in English Language, Mathematics, Physics and any other two subjects from Chemistry, Technical Drawing, Building Construction, Geography, Economics and Biology.

(b) **The UTME subjects** include English Language, Mathematics, Physics and any other subject chosen from Chemistry, Biology, Technical Drawings, Geography, Economics.

(c) Candidate who passed Pre-Degree Examinations from recognized Universities in addition to meeting the O Level requirements in (1a) above will be considered if the candidate registered for JAMB and scored not less than minimum pass mark for universities.

2. Direct Entry

Candidates for Direct Entry into 200 Level, in addition to meeting the O Level requirements in (1a) above should have any of the following:

(a) Ordinary National Diploma (OND, minimum of Lower Credit) / Higher National Diploma (HND, minimum of Lower Credit) in Quantity surveying, Building/ Building Technology, Architecture, Civil Engineering, Mathematics/ Statistics, Surveying & Geoinformatics, Estate Management and Accountancy, from recognized Polytechnics.

(b) General Certificate of Education or its equivalent with three passes at the Advanced Level (AL) in not more than two sittings including Mathematics and two other subjects from Physics, Chemistry, Economics, Geography and Technical Drawing; and satisfy the general entry requirements of the University.

(c) Candidates who fulfil the University entry requirements in (1a) above and have obtained GCE A-Level/ JUPEB/IJMB or approved equivalents with passes in Mathematics and Physics.

3) FACULTY OF ENGINEERING

A) B.Eng. CIVIL ENGINEERING

Programme Duration: 5 (Five) Academic Sessions

UTME REQUIREMENTS:

Candidates seeking admission into the Department must satisfy the general regulations governing admission to undergraduate programmes at the Redeemer's University. The minimum requirements for admission to courses leading to B.Eng. degree in the Department of Civil Engineering include;

Five ordinary level credits pass in nationally recognized examination: English, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and other acceptable science subjects at not more than two sittings. It is also desirable for the candidate to pass Further Mathematics and Technical Drawing at credit levels; such candidate shall have added advantage. For UTME and Post UTME Examinations, candidate four subject combinations to be taken are: Use of English, Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics respectively.

DIRECT ENTRY:

In addition to Level requirements, Direct Entry candidates must have passes in Mathematics, Physics, and Chemistry at GCE 'A' level or equivalent. Also, holders of OND (Ordinary National Diploma) at minimum of upper credit level are eligible for consideration for admission into 200 Level. Furthermore, students with Joint University Preliminary Examination Board (JUPEB) results are also eligible for admission into 200-level.

FOR INTER-UNIVERSITY TRANSFER MODE:

As applicable in other programmes in the university, students from another programme within the university or another university can transfer into 200-level in the Department provided they have relevant qualifications. The minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) obtained by such candidate in their previous programme or university shall be not be less than 3.50. The grades obtained by such candidates in their previous university or programme shall be as acceptable to the Faculty of Engineering.

SPECIAL WAIVERS:

DE and transferred students should register for and pass all University and Faculty required courses. However, a transferred student may be exempted from offering some courses, e.g Use of English Language, if he/she has passed the prescribed examination in the courses in their former university

B) B.Eng. COMPUTER ENGINEERING
Programme Duration: 5 (Five) Academic Sessions

O' Level Requirements

- (a)** Candidates must have obtained credit passes **at not more than two sittings** in five subjects at the 'O' Level/Senior Secondary Certificate (WAEC; NECO, etc.) in **English Language, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry** and any **of the following acceptable science subject: Further Mathematics, Biology, Technical Drawing, Computer Studies, Geography**

UTME Requirements

- (b)** Candidates must take at the UTME, **Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and English.**

For Direct Entry

- (a) Candidates must have obtained credit passes at not more than two sittings in five subjects at the 'O' Level/Senior Secondary Certificate (WAEC; NECO, etc.) in English Language, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and any of the following acceptable science subject: Further Mathematics, Biology, Technical Drawing, Computer Studies, Geography

In addition, candidates must possess:

- (a) Candidates must have passed the following subjects: Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry at the G.C.E. A' Level or its equivalent (JUPEB, IJMB, HSC etc)

OR

- i. ND in Computer Engineering with a minimum of upper credit.

OR

- ii. Students from another programme within University and other University can transfer into 200-Level in the Department provided they have minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) not be less than 3.50.

C) B.Eng. ELECTRICAL AND ELECTRONIC ENGINEERING

Programme Duration: 5 (Five) Academic Sessions

Candidates seeking admission into the Department must satisfy the general regulations governing admission to undergraduate programmes at the Redeemer's University. In addition, the following departmental requirements should be satisfied:

Five Ordinary Level credit passes in English Language, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and other acceptable science subject at not more than two sittings.

For UTME Entry Mode

In addition to acceptable passes in UTME (Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry), the minimum academic requirement is credit level passes in at least five subjects at O' Level in nationally recognised examination including English Language, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and other acceptable science subject at not more than two sittings. It is also desirable for candidates to pass Further Mathematics and Technical Drawing at credit levels, such candidates shall have added advantage.

For Direct Entry Mode

In addition to 'O' Level requirements, Direct Entry (DE) candidate must have passes in Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry at GCE 'A' level or equivalent. Also, holders of ND at minimum of upper credit level are eligible for consideration for admission into 200 level. Redeemer's University Foundation students are required to have sat for Physics, Mathematics and Chemistry/Biology at JUPEB and obtained at least a pass in Physics, in addition to a minimum of 2.4/5.0 CGPA in the University one-year Foundation Programme.

For Inter-University Transfer Mode

As applicable in other programmes in the university, students from another programme within the university or another University, can transfer into 200-Level in the Department provided they have relevant qualifications. The minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) obtained by such candidates in their previous programme or university shall be not be less than 3.50. The grades obtained by such candidates in their previous university shall be as acceptable to the Faculty of Engineering.

Special Waivers:

DE and transferred students should register for and pass all University and Faculty required courses. However, a transferred student may be exempted from offering some courses, e.g. Use of English Language, if he/she has passed the prescribed examinations in the courses in their former universities.

D) B.ENG. MECHANICAL ENGINEERING

Programme Duration: 5 (Five) Academic Sessions

Candidates seeking admission into the Department must satisfy the general regulations governing admission to undergraduate programmes at the Redeemer's University. In addition, the following departmental requirements should be satisfied:

2.0 O' Level Requirements

- a) Candidates must have obtained credit passes **at not more than two sittings** in five subjects at the 'O' Level/Senior Secondary Certificate (WAEC; NECO, etc.) in **English Language, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry** and any **of the following acceptable science subject: Further Mathematics, Biology, Technical Drawing, Computer Studies, Geography**

2.1 UTME Requirements

- b) Candidates must take at the UTME, **Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and English.**

2.2 For Direct Entry:

In addition to 'O' Level requirements, Direct Entry candidate must have passes in Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry at GCE 'A' level, JUPEB or equivalent. Also, holders of ND at minimum of upper credit level are eligible for consideration for admission into 200 level.

2.3 For Inter-University Transfer Mode:

As applicable in other programmes in the university, students from another programme within the university or another University, can transfer into 200-Level in the Department provided they have relevant qualifications. The minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average obtained by such candidates in their previous programme or university shall not be less than 3.50. The grades obtained by such candidates in their previous university shall be as acceptable to the Faculty of Engineering.

2.4 Special Waivers:

DE and transferred students should register for and pass all University and Faculty required courses. However, a transferred student may be exempted from offering some courses, e.g. Use of English Language, if he/she has passed the prescribed examinations in the courses in their former universities.

c) **FACULTY OF HUMANITIES**

A) BSc. CHRISTIAN RELIGIOUS STUDIES

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

Basic Admission Requirements

The criteria for admission into the B.A programme will be as follows:

UTME Applicant

5 O'Level credit passes in the SSCE/NECO/GCE (O/L) examinations relevant subjects in Arts and Social Sciences including English language.

UTME Requirements

Candidates applying to the Redeemer's University are expected to sit for the Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) and attain the National Aggregate Score. This is a statutory requirement for entry into Nigerian universities. Candidates are required to apply for programmes of their choice by completing the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) Registration Forms. They are to ensure that their UTME subject combination qualifies them for their chosen programmes.

Direct Entry: 3-Year Degree Programme

- i) Five credits in General Certificate of Education (GCE), Ordinary Level and NECO at least two of which must be at GCE Advanced Level including Christian Religious Knowledge.
- ii) A pass in two principal subjects at the NCE Level/ A/L plus three credits at the GCE 'O' Level including English Language.
- iii) A Three-Year Diploma in Theology or its Equivalent from a recognized University, Bible College or Seminary plus three credits at the GCE 'O' Level including English Language admits candidates into a Three-Year Degree Programme. Recognized Institutions include, Baptist Seminary, Ogbomoso; Redeemed Christian Bible College, Redemption Camp, Ogun State; The Redeemed School of Mission (RESCOM), Ede; C.A.C Seminary, Ile-Ife, Osun State., etc.

Inter/Intra-University Transfer

Students must have the basic requirements stated above and must present official transcripts of courses already offered in the former school which will be treated according to individual merit.

Duration of Programme

The minimum duration of the programme shall be four years for UTME candidates and three years for Direct Entry and Inter-University Transfer candidates.

B) B. A. ENGLISH

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

UTME MODE: 4-Year Degree Programme

5 credit level passes in the SSCE/NECO/GCE (O/L) examinations to include English Language and Literature in English, and any three from Arts e.g. CRS, Yoruba, /Igbo/Hausa, History, French, Music OR Social Science subjects e.g. Government, Economics, Civic Education or Tourism.

DIRECT ENTRY: 3 – Year Degree Programme

Two passes at the GCE (Advanced Level) or its equivalent one of which must be Literature in English with 3 other relevant subjects in WASC/NECO or GCE (Ordinary Level).

TRANSFERRED STUDENTS

Students must have the basic requirements stated above and must present official transcripts of courses already offered in the former school which will be treated according to individual merits.

C). B. A. FRENCH

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

(a) UTME Candidates: 4-Year Degree Programme

Candidates seeking admission into the Department of French must possess five (5) credit passes in the SSCE/NECO/GCE (O/L) examination at one sitting or six (6) credit passes at two (2) sittings in relevant subjects including English and two other Arts subjects.

(b) CEF awarded by Alliance Française or Pre-Degree Certificate in French from any recognized University, plus the necessary O'Level requirements.

(c) UTME subject combination should include English language, and any 3 subjects from Arts or Social Sciences.

- ii. DALF (Module III), Diplôme Supérieur and Baccalauréat from Francophone Countries may also be accepted provided the candidate has five (5) O'Level Credit Passes in SSCE (WAEC or NECO) in not more than two sittings.
- iii. OND/HND with French as a principal subject, not below Lower Credit, plus five (5) O'Level Credit Passes in SSCE (WAEC or NECO) in not more than two sittings.
- iv. TRANSFERRED STUDENTS: Students must have the basic requirements stated above and must present official transcripts of courses already offered in the former school which will be treated according to individual merit.

D) B.A. HISTORY AND INTERNATIONAL STUDIES

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

B.A. History and International Studies

Only students who meet the general University requirements for admission into Redeemer's University B.A. Programmes shall be offered places in the B.A. History and International Studies Programme at either 100 or 200 levels. Generally, prospective students must satisfy the following requirements before being offered admission into the Redeemer's University.

For admission into the 100 level (UTME), candidates should:

For admission into the 100 level (UTME), candidates should:

- i. obtain a minimum of 5 Credits passes at SSCE (or equivalent) in relevant subjects including English Language, History and or Government and four other Humanities/ Social Sciences subjects such as Literature in English, Christian Religious studies, Civic Education, Economics, Commerce, Geography, Yoruba Language, Music, Fine Arts French, Igbo Language, and Hausa Language; Mathematics; Food and Nutrition; in not more than two sittings;

Admission through Direct Entry

O'level: All candidates for an Honours degree in Philosophy must have at least **five (5) credit** passes in any subjects in Humanities, Social and Management Sciences or Natural Sciences including a **credit pass in English Language** and at least a **pass in Mathematics** in the GCE (O'level), WASC, NECO, or SSSCE with at least a pass in Mathematics at **not more than two sittings**.

For intra-University transfer, the grades for the 100 Level General Studies courses shall be acceptable to the Department but such candidates must register and pass all compulsory courses in 100 level which shall be spread across semesters and levels depending on the workload of the candidate.

F) B. A. THEATRE ARTS

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

Below is the admission requirement for Jamb, O'level and Direct Entry as requested

These requirements are in line with the guidelines provided by the National Universities Commission's Core Curriculum and Minimum Academic Standards (NUC-CCMAS).
Admission Requirements

Indirect Entry Mode (O' level): - Senior Secondary Certificate (SSC) or equivalent: Five credits in Mathematics, English Language, Chemistry, and Biology or Agricultural Science and other subjects including Data processing, Economics, and Civic education, in not more than two sittings.

- Pass in Physics: A pass in Physics is required.

- **UTME requirements:** Candidates must have an acceptable score in the Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) with relevant subjects' combination including Biology and any relevant science subject (Computer Science, Chemistry, Geography, Mathematics, and Physics).

Direct Entry Mode

- Ordinary National Diploma (OND) or National Certificate of Education (NCE): A minimum grade of Upper Credit in a relevant discipline.

- Higher National Diploma (HND): A minimum grade of Lower Credit in a relevant discipline.

- A-Level certificate: At least two passes (graded A-E) including Biology and any relevant subject (Botany, Chemistry, Geography, Mathematics, and Physics).

These admission requirements are designed to ensure that candidates possess the necessary qualifications and skills to succeed in the Department of Environmental Management and Toxicology.

D) **B. Sc. GEOLOGY**

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

GENERAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Candidates seeking admission into the Geology Programme must satisfy the general regulations governing admission to undergraduate programmes at the Redeemer's University. In addition, the following departmental requirements should be satisfied:

a) Candidates must have obtained credit at one sitting in five subjects or six subjects at two sittings at the O' Level/Senior Secondary Certificate (WAEC; NECO etc). Such credits must include **English, Physics, Mathematics, Chemistry, and any other one from Biology, Geography, Agricultural Science, and Technical Drawing.**

b) Candidates must take at the UTME, **English Language, Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry.**

The Direct Entry Requirements

For Direct Entry (DE), candidates must have registered for and passed at least two GCE 'A' level subjects or its equivalent which must include Physics and any of Mathematics, Chemistry, Biology or Geography. Holders of OND and HND at a minimum of lower credit level are eligible for consideration for admission into the 200 level. Redeemer's University Foundation students are required to have sat for Chemistry, Mathematics, and any of Physics/Biology/ Geography/ at JUPEB and obtained at least a pass in Chemistry, in addition to a minimum of 2.4/5.0 CGPA in the University one-year Foundation Programme.

E) **B.Sc. INDUSTRIAL CHEMISTRY**

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

Candidates applying to the Redeemer's University are expected to sit for the admission year Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME), and attain the National aggregate score. This is a statutory requirement for entry into Nigerian Universities. Candidates are required to apply for Programmes of their choice by completing the annual JAMB registration forms. They are to ensure that their UTME subjects combination qualify them for BSc (Hons) Industrial Chemistry.

In addition, candidates must complete online application form for Redeemer's University. No admission into Redeemer's University is possible without participation in the University's

screening exercise and the attainment of the required standard for admission into the University.

ENTRY INTO 100 LEVEL

Candidates seeking for admission into the Department of Chemical Sciences for Industrial Chemistry Programme are expected to have five (5) Ordinary Level Credit Passes **in English Language, Mathematics, Chemistry, Physics and Biology/Agricultural Science.**

UTME Subjects: Use of English, Chemistry and any other two (2) subjects from Physics/Mathematics/Biology/Agricultural Science.

ENTRY INTO 200 LEVEL

Candidates seeking for Direct Entry (DE) admission into the Department of Chemical Sciences for Industrial Chemistry Programme are expected to have five (5) Ordinary Level Credit Passes in English Language, Mathematics, Chemistry, Physics and Biology/Agricultural Science.

Also, DE Candidates are expected to possess one of the following;

1. Cambridge Advanced Level, Joint Universities Preliminary Examination Board (JUPEB) Advanced Level or Interim Joint Matriculation Board (IJMB) Advanced Level with a minimum of six (6) points in any three (3) relevant subjects, preferably from Chemistry, Mathematics, Physics and Biology.
2. Diploma from any University approved by Senate.
3. National Diploma with at least Upper Credit in relevant Programmes.
4. NCE with minimum of Merit passes in two (2) teaching subjects.

F) B.Sc. INDUSTRIAL MATHEMATICS

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

SSCE:

English language, Mathematics and any 3 from Chemistry, Physics, Biology/Agric. Science or Economics.

UTME:

English Language, Mathematics and any 2 from Physics, Chemistry or Economics.

G) B.Sc. INDUSTRIAL MATHEMATICS WITH COMPUTER SCIENCE

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

O'LEVEL SUBJECT

English language, Mathematics and any 3 from Chemistry, Physics, Biology/Agric. Science or Economics.

UTME SUBJECT

English Language, Mathematics and any 2 from Physics, Chemistry or Economics.

H) B.Sc. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

UTME SUBJECT

UTME subjects are English, Mathematics, Physics and any one of Chemistry, Biology and Geography

O'LEVEL SUBJECT

Applicants must possess five credit passes at the SSCE (or its equivalent) including English, Mathematics, Physics; and two other science subjects chosen from among the following: Further Mathematics, Chemistry, Biology or Agricultural Science, Data Process and Computer Studies

DIRECT ENTRY

1. Two advanced level passes in Mathematics and any of Physics, Chemistry, Biology in GCE 'A' Level/JUPEB/IJMB or its equivalent.

2. Upper credit in ND/NCE in Computer Science or any other related discipline

I) **B.SC MICROBIOLOGY**

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

Candidates seeking admission into the programme must have:

A. ADMISSION BY UTME

Credit pass in five ordinary level subjects including English, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry and Physics at one sitting or six credit passes at two sittings.

UTME subject combination:

1. English Language
2. Mathematics/Physics
3. Biology
4. Chemistry

Candidates applying for admission must have sat for the UTME with the recommended minimum score. Such candidates are also required to sit for and pass the Post-UTME organized by the University

B. ADMISSION BY DIRECT ENTRY

Candidates seeking admission into 200 Level (direct Entry) must satisfy the following requirements

- Credit passes in five ordinary level including English, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry and Physics at one sitting or six credit passes at two sittings
- Obtain at least two 2A' Level passes at GCE or its equivalent in relevant subjects.
- Holders of OND/ND with Upper Credit pass or NCE with overall Credit Pass are eligible for admission to 200L.

C. JUPEB/FOUNDATION PROGRAMME

Only students with a minimum point of six (6) on a scale of fifteen (15) shall be considered for admission

D. INTER-UNIVERSITY TRANSFER

Candidates seeking to transfer from another University must satisfy the following

- Must be from other universities as recognized by the Senate of the University
- Transfer can only be from Microbiology, Biochemistry, Nursing, Medical Laboratory Sciences, Physiotherapy and other relevant life sciences
- Should provide a satisfactory transcript result not below CGPA 1.50
- Can only be admitted into 200L.

J) B.Sc. PETROLEUM CHEMISTRY

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

O'LEVEL SUBJECT

Admission to 100 Level is through UTME. A student seeking admission into the Department for Petroleum Chemistry is expected to have five 'O' Level Credit passes in **English Language, Mathematics, Chemistry, Physics** and **Biology/Agricultural Science**

UTME Subjects: Use of English, Chemistry and any other two (2) subjects from Physics/Mathematics/Biology/Agricultural Science.

Direct Entry:

To qualify for admission to 200 Level, applicants should possess any of the following qualifications, in addition to possessing the requirements for admission to 100 level:

- (I) Two Advanced Level Passes in Chemistry and Physics or Mathematics;
- (II) Upper Credit in ND/NCE in Chemistry/Industrial Chemistry/Petroleum Chemistry and another Science subject;
- (III) Credit in Professional Diploma in Chemistry/Industrial Chemistry/Petroleum Chemistry obtained from a recognized institution;
- (IV) Two Advanced Level passes in Chemistry and Physics or Mathematics in IJMB and
- (V) Two Advanced Level passes in Chemistry and Physics or Mathematics in JUPEB

K) B. Sc. PHYSICS WITH ELECTRONICS

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

GENERAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Candidates seeking admission into the Department of Physical Sciences programmes must satisfy the general regulations governing admission to undergraduate programmes at the Redeemer's University. In addition, the following departmental requirements should be satisfied: Five Ordinary Level credit passes in **English Language, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, and any of Further Mathematics, Technical Drawing, Biology, Agricultural Science and Geography.**

The UTME Requirements

The required UTME subjects are **Mathematics, English Language, Physics and any of Chemistry, Biology, Agricultural Science and Geography.** Candidates are required to have an acceptable pass in UTME. The possession of Further Mathematics and Technical Drawing at credit levels would be advantageous for candidates.

The Direct Entry Requirements

For Direct Entry (DE), candidates must have registered for and passed at least two GCE 'A' level subjects or its equivalent, which must include Physics and any of Mathematics, Chemistry, Biology or Geography. Holders of OND and HND at a minimum of lower credit level are eligible for consideration for admission into the 200 level. Redeemer's University Foundation students are required to have sat for Physics, Mathematics, and Chemistry/Biology at JUPEB and obtained at least a pass in Physics, in addition to a minimum of 2.4/5.0 CGPA in the University one-year Foundation Programme.

L) B.SC. STATISTICS

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

SSCE:

English, Mathematics, any 3 from Further Maths, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Economics, Geography and Agricultural Sciences.

ADMISSION through Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME)

English, Math, any 2 from Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Agricultural Science.

M) B.SC. STATISTICS WITH DATA SCIENCE

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

SSCE

English, Math, any 3 from Further Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Economics, Geography and Agricultural Sciences.

ADMISSION through Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME)

English, Mathematics, any 2 from Physics, Chemistry, Economics/Geography

f) **FACULTY OF SOCIAL SCIENCES**

A) B.SC. ECONOMICS

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

The admission requirements for prospective candidates seeking admission into the Department of Economics in Redeemer's University, starting from 2025/2026 academic session are stated as follow:

ADMISSION through Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME)

(a) A candidate seeking admission to study Economics in Redeemer's University must have obtained Credit Pass in Five Subjects at a sitting or not more than two sittings at O' Level/Senior Secondary Certificate (SSCE), West Africa Examination Council (WAEC), General Certificate of Examination (GCE) or National Examination Council (NECO). The Credits must include **Economics, Mathematics, English, and any other two relevant subjects such Geography, Agric Science, Commerce, Government or Physics.**

(b) The candidate must have sat for Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination, and offered **Economics, Mathematics, English Language** and any one among **Commerce, Geography, Agric Science, Government or Physics.** The candidate should not have scored less than 200 in aggregate.

DIRECT ENTRY

(a) Any candidate seeking admission through JAMB direct entry shall be admitted into 200 level of Economics programme

(b) The Candidate seeking admission through DIRECT ENTRY mode must have O'level Certificate, as the same with requirements in (a) under UTME.

(c) The candidate must obtain MERIT or UPPER CREDIT pass in either OND or HND, and not less than aggregate 12 points at NCE.

B) MASS COMMUNICATION

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

a) 100 Level Requirement

- i. SSCE: candidates must obtain at credit level, passes in the Senior Secondary Certificate (SSC) in five subjects including Mathematics, English Language and any three of the following arts or social science subjects in not more than two sittings: Literature in English, History, Economics, Commerce, Government, Religious Studies, Fine Arts, French, Marketing, Insurance, Music, Accounting.
- ii. UTME: English Language, Literature in English and any two of the following: History, Economics, Commerce, Government, Religious Studies (CRS/IRS), Fine Arts, French, Marketing, Insurance, Music, Accounting, Yoruba, Igbo and Hausa

b) 200 Level (Direct Entry)

Any one of the following qualifications is acceptable for the three-year degree programme.

- i. A pass at merit level in a diploma programme in Mass Communication, Journalism or related disciplines (provided the SSC requirements are satisfied).
 - ii. Two passes in relevant subject areas at advanced level.
 - iii. Passes in two major subjects in relevant areas in the NCE.
 - iv. Two passes at the IJMB (Interim Joint Matriculation Board) examination
- In addition, the candidate must possess five credit level passes in five subjects at Senior Secondary Certificate Examination (SSCE), which must include Mathematics, English Language and three other relevant subjects.

C) POLITICAL SCIENCE

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

O' Level and UTME Requirements

- (c) Candidates must have obtained credit passes at one sitting in five subjects or six subjects at two sittings at the 'O' Level/Senior Secondary Certificate (WAEC; NECO, etc.) in English Language, Mathematics, Government and any two from the following subjects; Economics, Commerce, Civics, Geography, History, Literature in English, Christian/Islamic Religious Studies.
- (d) Candidates must take at the UTME, English Language, Government and any other two from the following subjects: Economics, Commerce, Civics, Geography, History, Literature in English, Christian/Islamic Religious Studies.

For Direct Entry

- (b) Candidates must have obtained five credit passes at one sitting or six credits passes at two sittings at the 'O' Level/Senior Secondary Certificate (WAEC; NECO etc). Such credits must include in English Language, Mathematics, Government and any two from the following subjects; Economics, Commerce, Civics, Geography, History, Literature in English, Christian/Islamic Religious Studies.

In addition, candidates must possess:

(b) Candidates must have passed at least two of the following subjects at the G.C.E. A' Level or its equivalent (JUPEB, IJMB, HSC etc): Economics, Commerce, Civics, Geography, Government, Literature in English, Christian/Islamic Religious Studies

OR

iv. ND in Public Administration or related subjects acceptable to the Department with a minimum of Lower Credit.

OR

v. N.C.E with Distinction or Credit or Merit in Political Science or any other Social Science subjects.

OR

vi. University Diploma in Public Administration, Law and other University Diploma in related courses acceptable to the Department with a minimum of Lower Credit.

D) B.SC PSYCHOLOGY

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

Five (5) O' level credit passes in SSCE (WAEC or NECO) at no more than 2 sittings including English Language, Mathematics, Biology and any other two subjects from Government, Civic Education, Economics, History, Literature in English, CRS, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Geography, Computer Studies.

The UTME subjects include English Language, Mathematics, Biology and any other two subjects from Government, Civic Education, Economics, History, Literature in English, CRS, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Geography, Computer Studies.

Three Years Programme

In addition to the UTME requirements, candidate must have passed at Credit Level in at least two subjects from either Social Sciences, Arts or Sciences at HSC or GCE A' Level, Registered Nurse certificate or related courses with minimum of Lower Credit.

OR

NCE with minimum of a Merit pass in any Social Sciences, Arts or Sciences subject.

OR

University Diploma with a minimum of Lower Credit in Social/ Community Development or Health Science related courses.

E) B.SC. SOCIOLOGY

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

UTME SUBJECT

Candidates must take at the UTME, English Language and any other three from the following subjects: Economics, Commerce, Civic Education, Government, Geography, and History.

O'LEVEL SUBJECT: Candidates must have obtained credit passes at one sitting in five subjects or six subjects at two sittings at the 'O' Level/Senior Secondary Certificate (WAEC; NECO, etc.) in English Language, Mathematics, and any three from the following subjects: Economics, Commerce, Civic Education, Government, Geography, History, Literature in English, and Christian/Islamic Religious Studies

DIRECT ENTRY: Candidate must have passed at credit level in at least two Arts or Social Sciences subjects in the HSC or A' Level GCE. **OR**

Minimum of Lower Credit in Ordinary National Diploma (OND) in Social Work or Community Development or other related courses acceptable to the Department/ Social Science Discipline.

OR

NCE with distinction or credit in any Social Science subject.

OR

University Diploma with a minimum of Lower Credit in Social Work or Community Development, Industrial and Labour Relations and other University Diploma related to the course of study

INTER-UNIVERSITY TRANSFER: Candidate must obtain at least credit passes in English language and Mathematics plus credit pass in either Economics, Geography, Government, Civic Education, and any other related Social Science or Arts subjects at the Senior Secondary School Certificate, GCE or NECO or other equivalents at not more than two sittings.

In addition, candidates must have a CGPA not lower than 1.5 to be accepted into 200 level. Candidate with CGPA less than 1.5 would be accepted into 100 level.

F) **B.SC. SOCIAL WORK**

Programme Duration: 4 (Four) Academic Sessions

UTME SUBJECT: Candidates must take at the UTME, English Language and any other three from the following subjects: Economics, Commerce, Civic Education, Government, Geography, and History.

O'LEVEL SUBJECT: Candidates must have obtained credit passes at one sitting in five subjects or six subjects at two sittings at the 'O' Level/Senior Secondary Certificate (WAEC; NECO, etc.) in English Language, Mathematics, and any three from the following subjects: Economics, Commerce, Civic Education, Government, Geography, History, Literature in English, and Christian/Islamic Religious Studies

DIRECT ENTRY: A candidate is expected to meet the minimum entry requirement into the University as well as possess any of the following:

At least two Arts or Social Sciences subjects in the HSC or GCE Advanced Level.

OR

Minimum of Lower Credit in National Diploma in Social/Community Development, Health Sciences, or related subjects acceptable to the Department/ Social Sciences.

OR

NCE with a minimum of merit passes in social studies and any other related arts or Social Sciences.

OR

University Diploma in Social Work, Community Development, Health sciences, or any other university diploma related courses acceptable to the Social Sciences with a minimum of lower credit.

OR

Possession of the Nursing profession certificate with minimum of lower credit

INTER-UNIVERSITY TRANSFER: Students can transfer into 200-Level courses provided they have the relevant qualifications and the requisite CGPA of not less than 1.5.

PROCEDURE FOR INTER-UNIVERSITY TRANSFER

A prospective candidate seeking transfer to Redeemer's University should go through the following procedure:

1. Write an application to the Registrar, indicating the intention to transfer to the Redeemer's University.
2. Visit adms.run.edu.ng or www.run.edu.ng to complete the Application Form, online. Ensure that you print the Acknowledgement Slip and attach to your documents.
3. Download the Redeemer's University Transfer Form from www.run.edu.ng. The Form is to be completed by the appropriate Officers of the current University as well as the appropriate Officers of Redeemer's University.
4. Attend an oral interview to be conducted by a Sub-Committee on admission exercise, as you would be notified.
5. Submit all copies of necessary documents (SSSCE Results, UTME Result Slip, Secondary School Testimonial, Birth Certificate, JAMB Admission Letter to the Current University) to the Admissions Officer.
6. Request your current University to forward a copy of your academic transcripts to The Registrar, Redeemer's University.

INTERNAL PROCEDURE FOR INTER-UNIVERSITY TRANSFER

1. Candidate's transcripts and other documents are forwarded to the respective Department/Faculty for comments/recommendations and, thereafter, to the Registrar and the Vice-Chancellor for approval if recommendations are favourable.
2. Admission Letter is issued to candidate.
3. Thereafter, the candidate is requested to commence the registration exercise, and also complete the following documents: Affidavit/Undertaking to Abstain/Refrain from Secret Cult/Occultism and Admission Oath.
4. Candidate shall provide a letter of guarantee of good behaviour from parent/guardian.
5. Approval for transfer would be limited to 100 Level and 200 Level only for a four-year degree programme, and maximum of 300 Level only for five-year degree programme in the Redeemer's University
6. Transfer is subject to availability of space in the proposed Department/Programme.
